Bridgeland Active Modes Improvements End-of-Season Construction Update

Thank you for your continued support and patience in 2023. We have reached the end of the 2023 construction season and want to provide you with an update on the Bridgeland Main Street project.

Background

The vision for the Bridgeland Main Streets project is to build a streetscape that includes well-designed, quality public realm elements and public space, that prioritize the pedestrian experience and will suppor safe, accessible mobility connections, new community gathering spaces, and a uniquely Bridgeland character.

The key features of Bridgeland Main Streets are:


- 1. Prioritize pedestrian safety
- 2. Enhanced landscaping for pedestrian comfort
- 3. Unique streetscape elements
- 4. New opportunities for community gathering
- 5. Improved mobility options

Completed Work

In 2023, we completed the streetscape improvements and infrastructure upgrades along Edmonton Trail from Memorial Drive to 2 Avenue N.E., as well as at the triangle where 4 Street meets Edmonton Trail addition of new naturalized turfs, decorative grasses and 127 new trees, and improving accessibility and connectivity with the completion of the new wheeling lanes on 2 Avenue N.E. between Edmonton Trail

The triangle greenspace located just north of 2 Avenue N.E. between Edmonton Trail and 4 Street N.E. was reconstructed into a more open and inviting space with new trees, native grasses, and new benche Bridgeland. Construction began this Fall on the operational and streetscape improvements along 1 Avenue between 9A and 11 Street N.E. These improvements are the result of feedback from community res improved street lighting, and crosswalks with accessibility ramps. Our goal is to enhance pedestrian safety and comfort, while improving connections and accessibility to park spaces, businesses, and ameniti

Construction is anticipated to begin again in the Spring of 2024 and continue through for the entire construction season. We are aiming to have all project construction completed in the Fall of 2025.
