
Bridgeland Active Modes Improvements

Calgary General Hospital 1910-1998

Long term Bridgeland business people will remember the day in 1998 when the Calgary General Hospital was imploded. All of Calgary watched and many wept as they remembered the important role 'the General' played over the years, growing from a single building for 166 patients in 1910, to Calgary's downtown hospital of over 1000 beds. Bridgeland-Riverside was a buzzing place as thousands of

staff, visitors and patients came here every day. Progressive medical care, a School of Nursing and important health care services were provided at 'The General' and local businesses saw the benefits.

The Bridgeland-Riverside Community Association is spearheading the Calgary General Hospital Commemoration Project—an initiative to tell the decades long story of 'the General'. We are planning enhancements to Murdoch Park at Centre Avenue and 7A to 8 Streets, incorporating the Memorial Wall and adding a gazebo, gardens, additional seating and information plaques. The new 'General Plaza' will attract more people to Bridgeland—to reminisce about the hospital, to learn something new and to spend some time here enjoying the park and the neighbourhood.

Exciting New Mural Installation in Bridgeland!!

The Bridgeland BIA is excited to announce that mural artist Nicole Wolf has been selected to install the new mural that will be located on the pillars under the flyover bridge.

The Bridgeland Business Improvement Area (BIA) invited artists or artist teams to submit qualifications for the design of two murals on overpass piers in Bridgeland, along Memorial Drive, between Edmonton Trail and 4 Street NE in May 2023. The murals are intended to be painted directly on the overpass piers to create a temporary, vibrant, and engaging landscape that will be enjoyed by motorists, pedestrians, businesses, and residents in the area while construction is underway on the Bridgeland Main Streets Improvements Program.

The murals are intended to be a temporary measure, in place for approximately 5 years, that will add visual interest and contribute to the vibrancy of the area. The location of the murals in the south gate of Bridgeland community opens opportunities to explore the community's roots through varying perspectives, including the relationship between Indigenous people and the local community people.

Goals

- Reflect the past of the Bridgeland community.
- Consider the historical and present-day context of the location and the variety of cultural communities represented.
- Create visual interest and encourage pedestrians, motorists, cyclists, and other roadway users to slow down and explore the community through its art.

Public engagement

Nicole is currently in the midst of conversations with the Bridgeland community, including residents, businesses,

indigenous and visitors to develop a concept that reflects the community.
