Bridgeland Riverside Area Improvements: Public Information Session March 18, 2023

Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) uses strategies that work together to create safer communities. It complements crime prevention strategies such as locks and bars, police and security personnel.

Here are a few examples:

- A well maintained home, building or community park creates a sense of guardianship and that helps deter criminals.
- Community activity is important. Criminal acts can be discouraged in public spaces when we encourage activities in those spaces by residents, visitors and other legitimate
 users.
- Natural access control guides help people enter and have a space through the placement of entrances, exits, fences, landscaping and lighting. It can decrease opportunities for criminal activity by denying criminals access to potential targets and creating a perception of risk for would-be offenders.

Business License Reinstated - March 17th

In March 2021 business license fees were waived for a period of two years as a way to alleviate stresses on businesses as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. On March 17, 2023, Business License Fees are going to be reinstated. The following fees will be reinstated:

- Business license fee (new: \$172, renewal: \$131);
- Fire inspection fee (new & renewal, from \$63 \$208);
- Planning fee (\$41); and
- Calgary Police Service (\$65)

DOAP Team? Or 911?

- UNDERSTANDING WHEN AND WHO TO CALL -

Please call the DOAP Team when:

- A non-emergent concern regarding intoxicated, unhoused individuals arises
- An unhoused individual requires a ride to a safe place to sleep
- A vulnerable individual who is intoxicated, but not in distress, may need assistance
- An individual or group are consuming alcohol or substances in public spaces

Please call 911 when:

- An individual is in medical distress, is in an unresponsive state (not just sleeping), has blue lips, or is experiencing a suspected overdose
- A significant physical injury has occurred and requires medical attention
- A crime or act of violence has happened or is currently in progress
- A weapon or threat of weapon is present

Alpha House's DOAP team and Calgary's Emergency Services work together to ensure the most appropriate service response to individuals in need. Alpha House's DOAP team is a non-emergent response to social issues and is not able to respond in situations related to violence or crime. When in doubt, call 911 and they can dispatch DOAP where appropriate.
